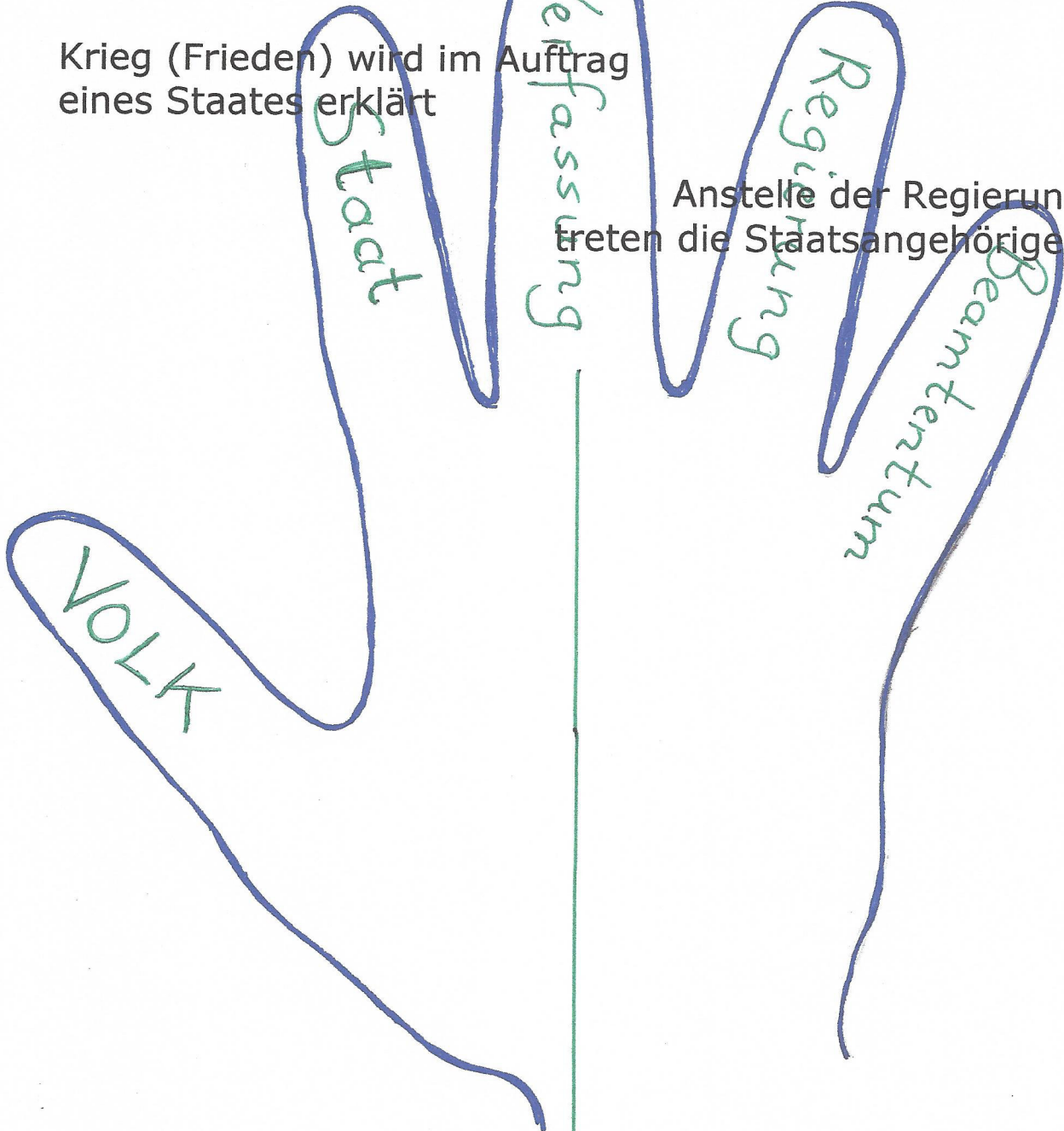

Verfassung von 1871 wurde vom deutschen Volk geschrieben und verabschiedet und ist bis heute gültig

25 Einzelstaaten verleihen die völkerrechtlich zu Stande gekommene Bundesstaatsangehörigkeit

Völkerrecht ist Verwaltungsrecht, die Administration einer Regierung und daher **nicht** staatlich

BGB 1900 (Natürliche Personen sind die Menschen)
Mann/Männin werden nur über Statuten an Gesetzgebung beteiligt, und zwar ausschließlich über die Person!

1913 Reichs- und Staatsangehörigkeitsgesetz (RuStAG)
Mann/Männin werden über staatliche Persona vertreten.
Natürliche Person ist in den Statuten verankert.

1914 Kriegsgesetz, Erklärung des Krieges gegen Regierungen

1917 Aufhebung des Kriegszustandes durch Aufhebung der Kriegsgesetze

8. November 1918 Karl Liebknecht und Scheidemann rufen die deutsche Republik als Bund aus. (Die Bundesrepublik und nicht Weimarer Republik)
Dies war eine parteipolitische Angelegenheit und privat!
Sie sagten zu den Frauen: Ihr dürft wählen wenn eure Männer uns wählen...

1918/1919 Die Armeen der Bundesstaaten kapitulieren. Der Kaiser hebt den Kriegszustand per Gesetz auf und wird dann abgesetzt.

28. Juni 1919 Vertrag von Versailles ist ein privater Vertrag zum Beitritt zum Völkerbund und ein sogenannter Friedensvertrag, privat von Dr. Bell und Hermann Müller unterschrieben. 25 rechtmäßige Vertreter der Bundesstaaten sowie der Kaiser oder der Präsident des Reichstages hätten unterschreiben müssen.

Die Bundesrepublik (Bundesfreistaat) wird als Verwaltung hergestellt.

1933 Machtergreifung Adolf Hitlers. Personalausweis

1937 Reichsbürgergesetz: treue deutsche Staatsbürger werden durch Reichsbürgergesetz ausgegrenzt. Personalausweis und eine verwaltungstechnische deutsche Staatsangehörigkeit
Hitlerhörige- romanische- und slavisches Bürger, sowie „jüdische Mischlinge“ sollten alleinige Besitzer von Recht sein. Sie sind per Gesetz die Reichsbürger.

Das Grundgesetz schreiben die Alliierten!

1948 Grundgesetz verbietet unter Strafe alle Gesetze aus der Zeit der Nationalsozialisten.

2010 Merkel nimmt Reichsbürgergesetz als Vorlage zum neuen Staatsangehörigkeitsgesetz und versucht alleine die verwaltungstechnische einheitliche deutsche Staatsangehörigkeit einzuführen.

PRÄAMBEL

Wir, das Volk der Vereinigten Staaten, von der Absicht geleitet, unseren Bund zu vervollkommen, die Gerechtigkeit zu verwirklichen, die Ruhe im Innern zu sichern, für die Landesverteidigung zu sorgen, das allgemeine Wohl zu fördern und das Glück der Freiheit uns selbst und unseren Nachkommen zu bewahren, setzen und begründen diese Verfassung für die Vereinigten Staaten von Amerika.

ZUSATZARTIKEL XIV*

Abschnitt I

Alle **Personen**, die in den Vereinigten Staaten geboren oder eingebürgert sind und ihrer Gesetzeshoheit unterstehen, sind Bürger der Vereinigten Staaten und des Einzelstaates, in dem sie ihren Wohnsitz haben. CHARTA DER GRUNDRECHTE DER EUROPÄISCHEN UNION

Artikel 47

Recht auf einen wirksamen Rechtsbehelf und ein unparteiisches Gericht

Jede Person, deren durch das Recht der Union garantierte Rechte oder Freiheiten verletzt worden sind, hat das Recht, nach Maßgabe der in diesem Artikel vorgesehenen Bedingungen bei einem Gericht einen wirksamen Rechtsbehelf einzulegen.

Jede Person hat ein Recht darauf, dass ihre Sache von einem unabhängigen, unparteiischen und zuvor durch Gesetz errichteten Gericht in einem fairen Verfahren, öffentlich und innerhalb angemessener Frist verhandelt wird. **Jede Person** kann sich beraten, verteidigen und vertreten lassen.

Personen, die nicht über ausreichende Mittel verfügen, wird Prozesskostenhilfe bewilligt, soweit diese Hilfe erforderlich ist, um den Zugang zu den Gerichten wirksam zu gewährleisten.

You are not a Person, or an Individual, or even a human (legally speaking)

Person, noun. per'sn. -*Webster's 1828 Dictionary*. Defines person as: [Latin **persona**; said to be compounded of per, through or by, and sonus, sound; a Latin word signifying primarily **a mask used by actors on the stage.**]

Person - *Duhaime's Law Dictionary*. An entity with legal rights and existence including the ability to sue and be sued, to sign contracts, to receive gifts, to appear in court either by themselves or by lawyer and, generally, other powers incidental to the full expression of the **entity in law**.

Individuals are "**persons**" in law [*ens legis*] unless they are minors or under some kind of other incapacity such as a court finding of mental incapacity. Many laws give certain powers to "persons" which, in almost all instances, includes business organizations that have been formally registered such as partnerships, corporations or associations. -

Person - *Black's Law Dictionary 6th Edition, pg. 791*, defines 'person' as follows: "In general usage, a human being (i.e. natural person), though by statute term may include labor organizations, partnerships, associations, corporations, legal representatives, trustees, trustees in bankruptcy, or receivers."

A person according to these definitions, is basically an entity - **legal fiction** - of some kind that has been legally created and has the legal capacity to be sued. Isn't it odd that the word lawful is not used within these definitions?
